Survey conducted September 11 through September 12, 2018. 1,615 likely 2019 General Election voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2019 General Election. Margin of Error is +/-2.5% with a 95% level of confidence. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding.
